*Clothing, which includes jewelry, accessories should be free of messages that are violent, relate to drugs or alcohol, discriminate, or are pornographic.


*Clothing must cover the torso your belly. Clothing must conceal undergarments and tops must have armholes. Rips and tears must not fall in the torso area.

MRMS Summer Football Information



The MRMS summer football program starts on May 26th for rising eighth graders at RCHS! Eighth grades will practice from 3:45 to 5:45 Monday through Thursday. Rising sixth and seventh graders will practice 5:45 to 6:45 Monday through Thursday at RCHS as well.

The second week of June, June 6-15, is an off week, so no practice. Practice will continue the week of June 16-19, same time, days, and place. The weeks of June 20-July 8 is a two week dead period, so there will be no practice. Practice will continue the week of July 9.

The first day of football practice for Fall is TBD (waiting on guidance from state), but usually is around the beginning of August. More information will follow in the summer.

At the beginning of August, sixth and seventh graders will practice at MRMS. More information will follow during the summer.

Physicals need to be on file and have to be within year. The rules have changed and the form has changed. Athletes need a valid physical to participate in any programs. The school has the new forms. Please stop by the front office at MRMS for a form.
